TENNESSEE FIRE CHIEFS ASSOCIATION RECEIVES SAFER GRANT Grant Will Assist Communities in Recruiting and Retaining Volunteer Firefighters

February 10, 2022 | **Chantilly, VA** – The Tennessee Fire Chiefs Association (TFCA) proudly announces its receipt of a Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Recruitment and Retention grant, phase II, from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security in the amount of \$778,826 over two years. The TFCA will partner with the Volunteer Workforce Solutions (VWS) team of the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) to assist communities in achieving a viable and sustainable volunteer firefighting workforce.

Through the grant, a statewide volunteer firefighter media campaign will be implemented, including social media and radio ads, a recruitment video/PSA, and a revamped statewide campaign website. In addition, fifteen county department groups will be selected to receive further assistance, such as customized recruitment materials, a targeted recruitment/retention plan based on geographic information systems data, and more. During the first quarter of 2022, an application period will open for the fifteen interested county departments to apply for the extra support. To help improve volunteer firefighter retention, online training and in-person leadership workshops will be conducted throughout Tennessee and open to all departments to participate.

Being a volunteer is a rewarding experience and one of the best ways someone can make a difference in the community. The skills and experience gained as a volunteer firefighter are invaluable and have a positive and lasting impact on the lives of others. Local fire departments need volunteers of all skill levels and abilities who are willing and able to respond to
